A reminder that Heritage Open Days are with us this weekend: more than 30 buildings in Liverpool of architectural note which are not normally open to the public are welcoming the public today, tomorrow and Sunday. Details are available on website www.heritageopendays.org . This also shows buildings other parts of the North West which are open.

Some of these openings are run by Heritage Forum members: tomorrow (Saturday) Christchurch Old Church, Waterloo Road (off Crosby Road) and St Peter's Heswall (and other buildings in Heswall) are open 1000-1600 and St Bride's, Percy Street (behind the Anglican Cathedral) is open 1100-1600; on Sunday, the Wavertree Lock-up (Lake Road, near Wavertree High Street) is open 1200-1600, St Bride's is open 110-1600 and both the Athenaeum (by the Blue Coat School) and Christchurch Old Church, Waterloo (see above) are open 1000-1600. Princes Road Synagogue is also open – contact 709 3431. These are great opportunities to see parts of Liverpool's usually hidden glories.

Professor Drummond Bone will speak on "The State of the Arts on Merseyside" at 12.30 for 1 p.m. on Wednesday 21 September in the Rodewald Suite at the Philharmonic Hall.
